



Typhoon Related Information

On Saturday 12th October, Iwaki as well as many other regions throughout Fukushima and Eastern Japan was devastated by Typhoon No.19. Iwaki not only experienced widespread flooding, but up to a third of households lost their water for up to two weeks after the disaster.



This edition of Iwa-key includes some useful information regarding this latest typhoon and how to be prepared for future disasters.

Iwaki City Disaster Prevention Email Service

By registering via your PC or mobile device, you can receive alerts regarding warnings/advisories for various disasters such as typhoons, earthquakes and tsunamis as well as evacuation orders and advisories (the service is only available in Japanese).

How to register:

1. Send a blank email to iwaki@entry.mail-dpt.jp or use the QR code on the right. You will then receive an email to register for the service.
2. Click on the URL link in the email and agree to the Site Policy.
3. Select what notices you would like to receive.
4. Confirm and click "register". You will receive an email to confirm that your registration is complete.



Explanation of the Disaster Warning Levels (警戒レベル Keikai Reberu)

Level 3: 避難準備・高齢者等避難開始 Hinanjunbi / Koureishatou- Hinankaishi
Prepare to evacuate / Begin evacuating if you're elderly or ill etc. – Keep an eye on disaster updates. Evacuate early, if you feel unsafe.

Level 4: 避難勧告 Hinankankoku

Evacuation Advisory – You are advised to evacuate to a shelter or a safe location. But stay indoors if it is too dangerous to go outside.

Level 4: 避難指示 (緊急) Hinanshiji (Kinkyuu)

Emergency Evacuation Order – You must evacuate immediately. But stay indoors if it is too dangerous to go outside.

Level 5: 災害発生 Saigaihassei

Disaster has Already Occurred – Disaster is occurring right now. Evacuate immediately or do whatever you can to protect yourself (e.g. evacuate upstairs or away from cliff edge in case of landslides/ flooding).

Emergency Household Repairs

If you currently are unable to live in your home because it was partially or completely damaged from the typhoon, but the damage is repairable, then you may be eligible for emergency house repairs. If you are eligible, you can receive up to ¥595,000 to assist in repairing essential parts of your home to make it habitable again. Keep in mind that you will need your **Disaster Victim Certificate** and that other conditions may apply.

You can apply for the Emergency Household Repairs until 2nd December at the following locations and times:

Beware of Scammers or Fraudulent Businesses Taking Advantage of the Typhoon Disaster

As a result of the large-scale damage caused by the typhoon, there is a possibility that scammers or fraudulent businesses may take advantage of the situation.



For example, a person claiming to be a staff member of City Hall may come to your house offering to help clean your house or clear mud and then suddenly demand a large sum of money. Another example may be that you requested a company to give you a quote for roof repairs only to find that they've covered your roof in tarpaulin and are demanding a large sum for repair costs.

Be Careful When Cleaning up Flood-Damaged Areas

If you are cleaning up your house or clearing mud out of your carpark etc. it is important to take precautions to prevent yourself getting sick or injured:



- Wear gloves, thick-soled shoes, long pants and long-sleeve shirts in order to minimise the amount of skin exposed and prevent infecting any cut wounds.
- Wear a mask to prevent inhaling dirt and dust and wear goggles and wash hands regularly to prevent getting any in your eyes.
- If you cut yourself while cleaning, rinse the wound with running water then sterilise the wound. If it is a deep or dirty wound, consult a medical facility.
- If dirt or dust gets into your eyes, wash immediately and see a doctor.
- Make sure to take plenty of fluids while you are cleaning to prevent heat exhaustion.
- Don't overwork yourself as the typhoon may have left you feeling physically or mentally fatigued and vulnerable to falling ill.

Workshop Event: Language Support in Times of Disaster

In light of this recent typhoon, the IIA will be holding workshops so participants can discuss ideas about how to assist foreigners, including evacuees, during times of disaster by experiencing a disaster from their perspective. Foreign residents are also welcome to take part in the workshop.
