## Lead-Up Event for the 8th Pacific Islands Leaders Meeting



The lead-up event featured traditional dances from Tonga, Fiji and Samoa as well as Iwaki's own jangara and hula dance performances. Away from the stage, there were also a variety of activities such as quizzes, rugby workshops and booths representing some of the PALM8 countries.





In order to help inform people about the Pacific Island nations and build up excitement for the PALM8 Summit, Iwaki City held a lead-up event for PALM8 at Iwaki Green Base on 4 March 2018 – 75 days before the summit. The official name of the event, *Dokidoki Shimashima 'Butousai' in Iwaki*, literally translates to "Exciting Islands Dance Festival in Iwaki".



The event turned out to be a huge success with thousands of people getting involved in the activities or watching the Pacific dances. Now Iwaki and the rest of Fukushima is eagerly awaiting the second consecutive PALM8 Summit in Iwaki.


